## Tri-City Food Pantry Facts:

- Tri-City Food Pantry serves an average of 125 households each month. In 2020, we served almost 1.600 households.
- Tri-City Food Pantry has a staff of 2 part-time employees and about 70 volunteers who assist clients, sort donations, stock shelves and bag groceries.
- A volunteer board of directors oversees the management of the Pantry.
- Churches, schools, businesses and individuals in the area provide support for the Pantry with both food and monetary donations.
- The Pantry space is provided by Heartland Family Service.

### What families receive:

- One-week worth of nonperishable food
- Fresh produce from our community garden
- 2 pounds of meat per person
- Gallon of milk, dozen eggs and block of cheese
- Bread and buns
- Toilet paper, Kleenex & paper towels
- 60-70 diapers for children under 3
- Baby wipes
- · Formula and baby food
- · Laundry soap & dish soap
- Personal hygiene items
- · Dog and cat food


